# **Calvary Hospital Emergency Preparedness**

### **Disaster Preparedness**

- Internal Incident
  - Is a significant occurrence that would cause the usual routine of the hospital to be seriously affected
  - May include failure of essential services
  - An explosion
  - Flooding
  - A fire
- External Incident
  - An event that occurs outside the hospital, which results in injury to a significant number of people
  - May include large vehicular accidents, hurricanes, snow storms, fires, floods, explosions, terrorism incidents
  - Due to Calvary's limited emergency treatment capabilities, response will be limited to an initial response until NYC Emergency Services arrives

**Bronx**: The Calvary response to a disaster is called Code HICS

The Command Authority, or his designee, has the authority to declare an emergency situation and activate the **EM** response

- The Command Authority will advise the operator to voice page HICS level 1, 2, 3, or 4
- The person who discovers an emergency incident will call 646-477-9388 and give all the known information regarding the incident
- During any type of EM incident there are specific departmental responsibilities in the facility's Emergency Management Plan
  - Refer to DEOP posted in your department
- Communication will be coordinated through the Incident Command Center:
   Administration Board Room
  - Command Center communicates with the field personnel with two-way radios

### What Are The Levels?

- Level 1 event is when we are preparing for something that has not affected us yet. An example is when the forecast is for a weather emergency that hasn't happened yet.
- Level 2 event is having a minor impact on the hospital. Most business as usual continues without interruption.
- Level 3 event is having a moderate impact on the hospital. Some business as usual continues, while other areas may be more affected.
- Level 4 event is having a major impact on the hospital.

  Most activities and functions are directed to dealing with the crisis.

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### **Status Report (STATREP)**

A STATREP is completed within 15 minutes of when Code HICS is announced, level changes or at least once per shift during the Code HICS

- S Staffing- total number of staff on unit
- T Total Patient Count-census on unit
- A Available beds on unit-empty beds
- T Technology Status e.g. Phones, Lights, Computers
- **R** Resource Status e.g. Stretchers, IV pumps, Wheelchairs, O<sub>2</sub> tanks, BP Machines.
- E Event Impact e.g. short staffed
- P Problems/Progress e.g. need more stretchers, relief for staff etc.

### **Internal Disasters - Bomb Threats.**

Please refer to Calvary Hospital Administrative Policy & Procedure F.09 Bomb Threats: In the Event of a threat, by phone or other means, The Assistant Administrator of Environment of Care/ President/CEO are Notified: In their absence the highest ranking Security officer present so response can be initiated.

### **Brooklyn**

- NYU Langone uses Plain Language Scripts for disasters or any incidents, e.g. for an evacuation, PA overhead announcement will be Facility Alert-Evacuation type-Location
- Calvary staff will continue their normal duties as assigned, unless instructed by the Satellite Administrator or designee to do otherwise. Return to the Calvary unit if you are off the unit.
